Dear Parishioners and Friends,

One of the most beautiful things about Australia is its multiculturalism. Every day we encounter people who have come from all over the world. Every family brings with it its language, way of thinking, culture, and values. Most, if not all, would love to live in peace and create and enjoy a safe environment where they can raise their families. It is a great richness.



This Thursday we celebrated ANZAC day, and (even at church) we remembered all those who fought in the First World War and other wars to ensure our freedom. Many have carried or still carry the scars of physical, emotional and other injuries they sustained. Others paid the ultimate price and laid down their lives. We remember. We are grateful. We pray for their souls, and for their grieving families.

The First World war was dubbed to be the War that Ends all Wars. Sadly, it didn't. ANZAC day gives us the opportunity to reflect on international relations and war. Disputes among people have existed since forever, and many have sought to resolve their differences through war. We ask, does war solve differences? In most cases, it does not! Rather, it creates more grievances, which are then harder to heal.

In his article in the Catholic Weekly (25th April 2024), Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ wrote the following: *In the face of present conflicts, Pope Francis follows earlier Popes in speaking of war as the enemy and calling for diplomacy to end them. This is always unpopular with people who see diplomacy as appeasement and anything short of unqualified victory as defeat. Anzac Day reminds us of the price that people pay for the wars their leaders join. The present wars remind us of the destruction of peoples and of their culture. Both call on us to support the work of people who try to make peace.*

Let us strive to create peace, not occasions for war. Starting from our little circle.

Reflect today, upon Jesus' words. Jesus says that He is the "true vine." He is the only source of the nourishment we

need for the new life of grace. He is the only way to Heaven and salvation. Knowing our Lord and being attached to Him firmly is faith. Second, our Lord says that He takes away every branch that does not bear fruit. This indicates that faith without the good fruit of charity is dead and is like a branch on a vine that produces nothing. Third, when Jesus finds a branch that bears good fruit, he doesn't leave it alone. Instead, He prunes it with loving attention so that "it bears more fruit" and so that God will be able to build up His Kingdom in glorious ways through you.

Jesus, most glorious Vine, You and You alone are the source of all nourishment in life. From You all good things come. Help me to have a firm faith in You and all that You have revealed, so that this faith will bud forth and bring about an abundance of good fruit for the glorious building up of Your Kingdom. Jesus, I trust in You.

LITURGY OF THE WORD - Fifth Sunday of Easter

First Reading:

Acts 9:26-31

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another.

Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

John 15:1-8

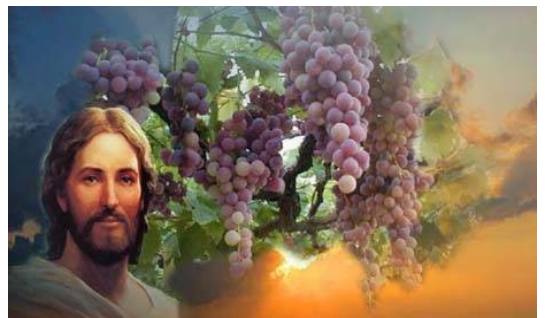
A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away - he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
